

What is CAL?

The Companion Leisure Card (CAL) grants free admission to the person who accompanying you in leisure, cultural and tourist outings.

To verify your eligibility, please read the following sections and fill out the application form.

Non resident of Quebec

A Non-resident of Quebec is anyone who is living outside of Quebec. For instance: Ontario, British Colombia, France, Germany, Belgium, China, Thailand...

Pilot project

In order to answer to a growing need and many requests received, l'AQLPH offers you to contribute to an all-new pilot project. It speaks to people with disabilities who are living outside of Quebec Province. It aims at providing them the opportunity to obtain a Leisure Companion Card (CAL).





What are the criteria to obtain your CAL?

1. To have a disability

An intelectual or a physical disability

- 2. To be 5 years old or above
- 3. To need the assistance of a companion to participate in a leisure, cultural, or tourist activity.

You need assistance with:

- Orientation
- Mobility
- Eating
- Communication with others
- Engaging in activities safely
- Assistance with personal needs

- 3. Include your photo in jpeg format
- 4. Send your request by email cal@aqlph.qc.ca

Allow 10 to 15 weekdays for your application to be processed and for your CAL to be delivered digitally via email.
